Key Note Speaker:

Tim Saltuklaroglu, Ph.D., CCC-SLP, Department of Audiology and Speech Pathology, University of Tennessee. Dr.

Saltuklaroglu is a person who stutters and entered the field of speech-language pathology to help others who stutter and learn more about the disorder. He has provided many different types of therapy for stuttering in the public school system and in university clinical settings to both children and adults who stutter. Dr. Saltuklaroglu has co-authored over 40 peer-reviewed publications on the nature and treatment of stuttering in addition to presenting his research at both national and international conferences.
