Daniel Hudock, PhD CF-SLP

Dr. Hudock is an assistant professor at Idaho State University. He obtained his masters then doctorate from East Carolina University with an expertise in fluency disorders and an interest in the neuroscience of speech perception. He has taught graduate classes in fluency disorders, research methods and an undergraduate class on speech science. His clinical experiences range from being a school-based private practice speech language pathologist to helping run intensive stuttering workshops.

Amy Jones, PhD

Dr. Jones is an Assistant Professor at Idaho State University in the Counseling Department and is the coordinator of the school counseling program. She earned her masters degree in Counseling at Vanderbilt University and her doctorate in Counselor Education and Supervision at the University of Toledo. Her work focuses on current trends in the school counseling profession and professional counselor training, including increasing the research self-efficacy of graduate students. She has been published in peer-reviewed journals and has presented at several local, state, and national conferences. She has experience in both clinical mental health and school counseling.
